### **Dress Code**

The responsibility for personal dress and grooming rests primarily with students and their parents. Clothing, which is comfortable, clean, and modest is conducive to a positive educational climate. The following points indicate our expectations for student attire at Mt. Lehman Elementary School.

- Clothing should be appropriate for a learning/working environment, e.g. beachwear is not appropriate for school. Shirts should fully cover the torso when standing. Undergarments should not be visible. Shorts should fully cover the bottom and upper thigh.
- Dress, grooming and accessories should be appropriate and not cause health and safety concerns.
- Hats and sunglasses should be removed inside the school.
- Clothing items that promote alcohol, drugs, inappropriate language, racism or are in poor taste are not acceptable for school.
- Physical Education classes require proper footwear(runners), i.e. flip flops/boots are not acceptable footwear for gym, inside or out.
- During physical activity times clothing should not move into a position that could cause embarrassment for the child.
- The school will contact parents when children come to school dressed inappropriately.

### Truth and Reconciliation/Orange Shirt Day

Truth and Reconciliation is recognized by students and staff by wearing an orange shirt to school on Thursday September 28<sup>th</sup>. On the 28<sup>th</sup> we will have a recognition assembly followed up with some classroom activities.

On September 29<sup>th</sup> is a Professional Development Day where teachers will be learning about teaching Truth and Reconciliation. Students will not be in attendance for the day.

### Attention Parents: PICK-UP AND DROP-OFF

Please review the following important safety rules and please help us keep all our children safe by following these rules every day, even when you are in a hurry.

#### • Drop-off and Pick-up

-Please drop-off your children in the drop-off zone in the morning and after school if you can't find parking.

-NO parking in the drop-off /pick-up zone. Your vehicle should remain on and your children will meet you in the pick-up and drop-off zone.

-Please <u>drive to the far end of the zone</u>, so more cars can fit in the drop-off/pick-up zone.

-<u>Do not leave the drop off zone until it is your turn to exit</u> (we want to avoid collision and congestion)

-<u>If your children are not present, loop around the zone again</u> and Ms. Lincoln or a staff member will find your children for you.

-If your child does not feel comfortable walking to the pick-up and drop-off zone you will have to park and walk in.

-You can park in the school parking lots, on the street, or the Community Hall.

-Students are not permitted to be crossing the drop-off and pick-up zone/parking lot without a adult. It is a very heavy traffic zone even though it is an elementary school parking lot.

Road Safety: No U-turns are permitted, be mindful of the crosswalk, watch your blind spots, slow down, it is a school zone, and pedestrians have the right of way. Crosswalk: Use the crosswalk.

Parents of Kindergarten students should park their vehicles and walk their children to class. The drop-off and pick-up zone should not be used unless your child can operate their own seatbelt and open and close the vehicle door on their own. The zone is constantly moving, and vehicles cannot be parked while parents help their children. Thank-you for your understanding.
